Snack and drinks will be provided at breaks.

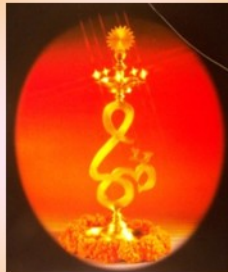
